CITY HALL & OTHER CITY OFFICES

PARKS

- Taking Root campaign (1,000 trees/year)

- Shoreline vegetative buffers



FIRE

- Decreased number of responding vehicles reducing fuel consumption and vehicle wear
- Replaced HVAC unit with more efficient model
- SAFE (Smoke Alarms for Everyone)
- Promoted new carbon monoxide detector rules

TRANSIT

- Four hybrid buses
- Adjusted signal timing for efficient traffic flow
- Installed intersection video detection equipment for more efficient signals
- Bike and pedestrian planning

- Electric motors upgraded to energy efficient models
- Planned for energy-efficiencies in proposed expansion



POLICE

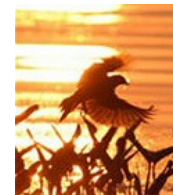
- Bike and foot patrols
