TRANSIT IN THE OSHKOSH AREA

Two transit services are operated in the City of Oshkosh. One is the Oshkosh Transit System, traditional bus and paratransit service operated by the city. The other is Titan Transit, an evening transit program offered by UW Oshkosh.

- **The Oshkosh Transit System** offers public bus service and paratransit service for elderly and disabled. Bus service is provided primarily within the city limits Monday through Saturday from 6:15 a.m. to 6:10 p.m. One intercity bus route operates to Neenah. All but one route originates and terminates at the Transit Center located on High Street just west of Main Street. Wheelchair lifts and bike racks are available on all buses. Bus schedules are available at the Transit Center. Paratransit service is provided by the Transit System through reduced fare taxi and Cabulance door to door service for seniors and disabled persons. - **Titan Transit** extends current service to provide the university with a safe, convenient, inexpensive and greener mode of transportation past 6 p.m. Titan Transit is an Oshkosh Student Association initiative. The bus operates during UW Oshkosh's two regular 14 week semesters. Two routes are available from 6-10 p.m. Monday through Saturday: a west side route, and a frontage road route. Faculty, staff and students with a valid Titan card ride free; others pay OTS regular fare. In addition, a free late night safe ride program runs from 10 p.m. to 3 a.m. Thursday through Saturday making a loop around the campus. Service is provided by Lamers Bus Lines.
